Easy enough for Drew Brees...more of a challenge for some third string center from Cortland State who will probably fade into Saint's history by the weekend.

Additionally you had to introduce the yearly winner of the club's Pete Rozelle award – usually bestowed on an old-timer

for his contribution to the NFL's history one year late in the Jim Mora era. It was given to original Dallas Cowboy President Tex Schramm. As he shuffled to the dais for his acceptance remarks it was obvious, he was in infirm health. And judging by the fistfull of handwritten pages he carried, we were to be treated to a long and tedious response.

As I was within an arm's length of him to Schramm's left, I thought I should at least feign being attentive out of respect. As I sat next to him with my head about level with his belt buckle, I was alarmed to see there was no belt buckle and a sartorial disaster could await.

Schramm's pants were beltless, sansabelt slacks, held up by a fatigued band of elastic. As he leaned forward grappling with his speech, his pants slid down from his ample stomach on their way south where his aged hips and butt offered little resistance.

As he tried to continue reading, his pants fell all the way to his ankles. I slid from my chair and crawled to his aid. Looking downward at me, the poor man said off-mike, "my God...nothing like this has ever happened to me!" Looking up in a stage whisper I replied, "just keep talking, no one's seen this!" On my hands and knees, I hoisted one pantleg at a time above his knees where he could snag his waistband and tug them back to their previous vicinity.

I low-crawled back to my seat and surreptitiously returned to my post. Saints team President Bill Kuharich who was seated to my left had seen the whole search and rescue. I met his wide-eyed, mouth agape look with one of my own.

Long before Janet Jackson's Super Bowl wardrobe malfunction shocked millions of NFL fans, a future hall of famer had experienced one of his own. In 2003 he took his secret to the grave.
